



Senator Jeremy Ring was elected to the Florida Senate in 2006. He has already established himself as a champion and as astute critic of postsecondary education, particularly in the area of research, economic development, and improving the ties between the universities and the commercial sector. Senator Ring was instrumental in the changes in the 21st Century Technology, Research, and Scholarship Act which saw the creation of the State University Commercialization and Assistance Grant Program.

Although he has been in the Senate for only one year, Senator Ring is Vice Chair for the Higher Education and Higher Education Appropriations Committees, and a member of the following Committees: Fiscal Policy and Calendar, Legislative Auditing, Joint Legislative Sunset Advisory, Social Responsibility Policy and Calendar, Agriculture, Commerce, and Judiciary,

Senator Ring is an Entrepreneur, and is Co-founder of SUPERB (Students United with Parents and Educators to Resolve Bullying), a member of the Board of Directors of the National Jewish Democratic Committee, the Advisory Committee of the Nova Southeastern University Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, the Board of Directors for the Florida Ocean Sciences Institute, the Board of Directors for the Daniel Centor Senior Center, the Knights of Pythias, and several Democratic and community organizations.
