**SUBJECT:** Public Notice of Intent to Repeal Board of Governors Regulation 6.022 –  
Veterans’ Benefits – Inmate Students

**PROPOSED BOARD ACTION**

Approve public notice of intent to repeal Regulation 6.022 for publication on the Board of Governors Web site pursuant to the Board’s regulation development procedure.

**AUTHORITY FOR BOARD OF GOVERNORS ACTION**

Section 7(d), Article IX, Florida Constitution

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Regulation 6.022 prohibits a university from certifying an incarcerated veteran student for Veterans’ Administration (VA) education benefits when the cost of the program is fully funded by the state. Federal regulations do not permit incarcerated veterans to be certified for more than tuition and fees, which would be zero dollars if the student’s educational program is fully funded by the state. Certification of veteran students is monitored by the VA and by the state approving agency for veterans’ education housed within the Florida Department of Veterans’ Affairs. For this reason, the regulation is unnecessary.

This regulation has been reviewed by the VA Senior Education Liaison Representative for Florida, the Council of Academic Vice Presidents, and university academic and student affairs staff.

Pursuant to the regulation procedure adopted by the Board at its March 23, 2006 meeting, the Board is required to provide public notice by publication on its Internet Web site at least 30 days before adoption of the proposed regulation.
