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The Accreditation Process

LCME Accreditation: Why it matters

- Access to residency and licensure
- Quality guarantee to the public
- Institutional development:
 - Comprehensive organizational analysis and review
 - Validation of faculty effort and outcomes
 - External diagnosis of defining characteristics and opportunities

Stages of LCME Accreditation for New & Developing Programs

- Preliminary Accreditation:
 - Authorization to recruit & enroll students, begin the educational program
 - 9-18 mo. before opening doors
- Provisional accreditation:
 - Outcome of early curriculum delivery,
 planning for clinical training
 - Early during second year of program

Stages of LCME Accreditation for New & Developing Programs

- Full Accreditation
 - Compliance with all accreditation standards
 - Late third year or early fourth year of program

The New Program Assessment Process

Stage 1: Preliminary Accreditation

- Core planning and consultation
 - Mission and goals
 - Educational philosophy
 - Organizational structure
- Initiation of LCME review
- Completion of a planning self-study and supporting documentation

The New Program Assessment Process

Stage 1 (continued)

- Decision Point 1: Readiness for on-site review
 - Coherence and consistency of planning
 - Credibility of timetable for resource development
 - Size and breadth of planning group
- On-site Review and Report
- Decision Point 2: Grant or deny preliminary accreditation, based on (anticipated) compliance with relevant standards

Expectations for Preliminary Accreditation

- Soundness of planning
- Adequacy of resources
 - Administrative leadership
 - Instructional staff
 - Educational Facilities
 - Financial support
- Curriculum Design Overall plan, details of first year
- Policies and Procedures
