Facts

- State economic development is directly related to higher education and the existence of top 10 universities
- Top 10 research benefits Florida's citizens; Florida's brightest students should not have to leave the state for access to a top 10 education
- UF is Florida's only university ranked among the top 50 (47th nationally and 13th among public institutions)
- Improvement in only one parameter faculty resources (number of faculty, faculty/student ratio, class sizes) would very likely move UF into the top 10 public list
- > UF's resources (annual tuition revenue, endowment) are considerably lower than the national institutions that UF competes against for faculty and students
- > All previous recommendations by the Universities, BOG, FC 100 and others have failed
- > State-wide tuition devolution is not likely in the near-term

Move UF from 47th to 39th overall among all universities nationally and from 13th to among the top 10 public universities


> A rising tide raises all ships: this national recognition will drive FSU, USF, UCF, FIU and FAU into the top 100 and beyond

How Do We Get There?

> UF already in the top 10 in most of the categories considered in the rankings

> UF is already a member of the AAU; only one of 60 universities nationally; one of 3 in the Southeast and the only one in Florida

> Faculty resources are the missing link

Supply and Demand Summary

- > The University of Florida is unique in Florida
 - Approximately 24,000 applications for about 6,500 spaces
 - Only about 4% of UF applicants are from Alachua County
 - Only 5% of all UF students are considered commuter, compared to an average of 32% for all other Florida universities
 - Only 3% of all UF students are part-time
 - Four- and six-year graduation rates of 52% and 78%, respectively

Other States: Tuition Differentiation

- > The top 15 public universities set tuition that differs considerably from the other public universities within their respective states
- > The flagship public AAU tuition premium ranges from:
 - 11% to 46% over other AAU/Top 50* universities in the same state
 - 85% to 150% over other Top 150* universities in the same state

The Time is Now

> Having a top 10 university should be one of our top priorities if we want to compete against other states

Ideal time to test a new approach

Supply and demand supports it from the viewpoint of number of applicants; the ratio of commuters to resident students; part-time vs. fulltime status; graduation rates

> Other states do it and it has proven to be a successful strategy

> This is the perfect way to introduce a new tuition policy in Florida



- Starting with the 2007 class, the Academic Enhancement Program calls for \$500 per semester – applies ONLY to new, incoming students; current students not affected
- 100% of all new revenue will be earmarked for 200 new faculty and 100 new academic advisors
- All students demonstrating financial need will not be burdened
- Program will be monitored by the BOT and reviewed with BOG periodically

Summary

- Best with the lowest tuition even after the increase
 - Lowest among the AAU
 - Lowest among the top 50
 - Lowest among the SEC
 - Only a 20% premium to FGCU and other state universities

• Students

- Improvement of undergraduate educational experience
- All current students are grandfathered
- Prospective students can make their own decision
- No financial burden for students demonstrating financial need
- All proceeds will be earmarked
 - 200 new professors
 - 100 new advisors
