Florida Partnership for Minority and Underrepresented Student Achievement

Deliverables

Activity	Description
AP Summer Institutes	Florida Partnership for Minority and Underrepresented Student Achievement (FLP) will offer scholarships to 1000 Florida teachers to attend Florida AP Summer Institutes in summer 2006. Scholarships cover up to \$500 in travel reimbursements, \$250 in stipends, and institute tuition/registration and fees that average \$500. This activity will cross over into FY 07. This growth from 850 scholarships in the previous year will allow College Board to push rigor into entire high schools and feeder middle schools.
Pre-AP Rigor in Middle Schools and High Schools	For middle school outreach and high school reform purposes, College Board will provide Pre-AP workshops available to schools by competitive application. These workshops will draw from entire faculty populations and will include offerings in Instructional Leadership, Vertical Teams, and Classroom Strategies. As part of the middle school outreach and secondary school reform effort, the College Board will offer college success materials for students and teachers. (This includes the cost of workshops, substitutes or stipends, travel, and meals for Florida teachers and administrators.)
Grants	College Board will provide Florida Partnership Opportunity grants to eligible outreach and faith based organizations and to approved member institutions (high schools, districts, community colleges, universities). This activity will cross over into FY 07.
Scholarships to College Board Meetings	Offer scholarships to the following College Board events for Florida educators – 2006 Southern Regional Forum (in Florida in February 2006), 2005 National Forum, 2006 AP National Conference (to be held in Florida), AP Summer Institute for Administrators, and 2006 Summer Institute on College Admissions. Scholarships cover registration fees and travel reimbursements up to \$100 per day. This activity will cross over into FY 07. Each scholarship winner will report on how he/she brought back to home school or district the message of rigor and advanced academics for all. Each scholarship participant will respond to a survey showing how they have parlayed their attendance and the information gained into action at the local school or district site.
Counselor Leadership Conference	This two day conference for district counselor leaders and school counselors will focus on advancing rigorous academics as this relates to the work of school counselors.
Florida Virtual School	The Florida Partnership will underwrite licensing for the Florida Virtual School's AP examination readiness courses for Florida students. FLVS will aggressively seek to ensure underserved students and their teachers will have primary access to readiness reviews. They will have a designated FLVS E-learning Manager responsible for outreach to communities and other groups within the FCAN system to ensure awareness of and access to the AP Exam readiness courses.
Integrated School Reports	These Web-available reports are produced annually for all Florida public schools and school districts. These reports show participation and performance on AP, PSAT/NMSQT, and SAT.
