## FACILITIES

(a) *Current status*: <u>Currently occupying</u> 34,510 sq. ft. of space in University Tower adjacent to UCF main campus where the first 40 M.D. students will begin their studies in August 2009. This newly renovated space includes LCME-reviewed facilities to support the delivery of the M.D. curriculum. The COM Burnett School of Biomedical Sciences utilizes approximately 60,000 sq. ft. of research and teaching space on the UCF campus. Two College of Medicine buildings, currently on schedule and within budget, are <u>under construction</u> on the new 50-acre UCF Health Sciences Campus at Lake Nona. The **Medical Education building** is a 170,000 sq. ft., 4-story building with the latest

technological advances for medical education. Completion is April 2010 with move-in date scheduled for May 2010. Topping out was December 2008. The **Burnett Biomedical Sciences building** is a 198,000 sq. ft. 5-story research facility that will be completed in approximately 7 weeks. Furniture installation begins April 10, 2009 with researchers and staff moving in shortly thereafter. There are 40 eight-person labs, 3 bio-safety level 3 labs, 23 specialty labs, offices for faculty and staff, including a vivarium. The 5<sup>th</sup> floor has been leased to M. D. Anderson Cancer Center.



(b) *Major thing that still needs to be done* is the completion and opening of the Medical Education building in 2010. Gifts pledged are sufficient when matched by the state. (c) Associations with other constituents include the following clinical affiliations that will provide the instructional locations and support for the clerkships: Florida Hospital, Lakeside Behavioral Healthcare, Orange County Health, and Orlando Health, Department; and pending affiliations with the Nemours and VA Medical Center. (d) *The expected status for Fall 2009*: the move of biomedical researchers to the new facility, the successful start of classes in University Tower facilities, and Medical Education building still under construction, within budget, and on time. (e) Other information: Both UCF COM buildings at Lake Nona are within budget and expected to open on time and received a positive review by the LCME Secretariat during a January 2009 invited visit. As promised, the Medical Education building is completely funded through private and local government gifts, and state matching funds and has received an urban design award. UCF COM is central to and the catalyst for the medical city that thus far includes The Burnham Institute for Medical Research, a developing Town Center, M. D. Anderson Cancer Center, Nemours Children's Hospital , VA Medical Center, and Research Campus, and UF Research Facility. The economic impact (Arduin, Laffer, and Moore Econometrics, 2008) of the medical cluster is estimated to be \$7.6 billion/yr. from 2017 onward; 19% higher than a previous estimate. The college has funded 40 full four-year scholarships through gifts for the entire inaugural class, has 4,307 applicants and offered seats to 25 students so far. The White Coat Ceremony, on August 3, 2009, will mark the beginning of the M.D. program.
