Florida International University College of Medicine Status Report for Board of Governors February 9, 2009

The FIU College of Medicine is fully prepared to receive the inaugural class on August 3rd, 2009. All facilities are in place and the founding faculty has been hired. The curriculum has been completed for the first two years. Additionally, affiliations with multiple clinical partners are completed. The College is ahead of schedule in preparation for Provisional Accreditation.

EXTERNAL FUNDING:

- (a) Total raised: FIU College of Medicine has raised \$54,150,503.
 (b) Dollars in-hand: FIU College of Medicine has received \$8,671,000.
 (c) Pledged but not in hand: FIU currently has pledges in the amount of \$36,140,650 in support of the College of Medicine including state match.

FACILITIES:

Current status: The facilities for the College of Medicine located at the FIU Academic Health Sciences Center include existing space at the Health and Life Sciences (HLS) Complex and Green Library buildings on the FIU University Park Campus. Additional space for the data coordinating center to support the NeighborhoodHELP™ program is located in Academic I building at the FIU Biscayne Bay Campus. The first class of 40 students will be taught at HLS II building. 17,000 sq. feet of space including lecture hall, office space, five small group rooms, lunch area, and educational technology are ready for students, faculty and staff. Green Library – 7,000 sq. feet of private library space including 40 study carrels, 1 student resource room, one large group room, and combined lounge and study space. All spaces are prepared and available for the arrival of the first class.

PARTNERSHIPS:

- Affiliations with Florida Department of Health, Jackson Health System, Leon Medical Centers, Mercy Hospital, Miami Children’s Hospital, Mount Sinai Medical Center have been completed
- Miami-Dade County has committed \$10 million for an on-campus ambulatory facility
