

EARLY ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

FTICS

- It appears there is a statewide decline in the number and percent of black FTICS admitted
- Much of the decline can be attributed to FAMU, though there are also significant declines at UF, FSU, USF, and FAU.
- There is an increase in the number and percent of Hispanic FTICS admitted statewide at this point
- Much of the increase can be attributed to FIU, though there are also significant increases at UF, FSU and UCF.

FAMU and FIU have both implemented new software systems over the last 18 months that may be affecting the year-to-year comparability of preliminary data such as this. That fact, and uncertainty about show rates make it hard to say that the apparent decline will result in a decline in actual number of students enrolled fall term.

OTHER PROGRAMS

- No trends jump out, positive or negative, in medical or law admissions (USF has not reported medical school numbers).
- Graduate school admissions data is hard to interpret; deadlines and reporting systems are much less consistent than for FTICS, and many decisions are still being made at the department or university level. We usually haven't looked at early numbers in the past, but they're included here anyway.
