Schedule 21: State your experiences and interests or elements of your personal history that qualify you for this appointment

Florida State University. I attended FSU from 1972-1974 and obtained a M.A. in English Literature from the Department of English. I returned to FSU from 1975 to 1978 and obtained a J.D. with honors from the College of Law. I have served on the FSU College of Law Board of Visitors continuously since 1994. I was Chair of the Board from 1999 to 2001. I have been a long time donor to the College of Law and have established an endowment fund of \$100,000 with the law school for the purpose of providing scholarships to students with outstanding academic credentials. In addition, I have sponsored the Book Award for Real Property course from 1994 to the present, which is awarded to the law student with the highest grade in Real Property. Last year I hosted a reception for FSU College of Law alums at my home. Each year as part of the Board of Visitors meeting, we meet in small sessions with the law students to discuss various topics. Through the years, I and my fellow panelists have talked with students about "Practicing Real Estate Law," "Destination South Florida: Breaking into the South Florida Job Market," Everything You Always Wanted to Know about Life in the Large Firm," "Preparing for a Career in Business Law" and "Women in the Legal Profession."

Spring Hill College. I served on the Board of Trustees of Spring Hill College (my undergraduate school) in Mobile, Alabama for nine years (2000 to 2009). I found the experience to be rewarding and challenging. I was fortunate to be a member of these critical committees: Executive Committee (2004 to 2009); Finance (2006 to 2009); Buildings and Grounds (2000 to 2009); and Academic Affairs (2000 to 2006). During my tenure on the Board, the college was engaged in a major building and renovation campaign which resulted in the transformation of the campus and the addition of a new library, student center (under construction) and 2 dormitories and major renovations of several classroom

buildings, the administration building, former library and 5 dorms. I served on the Buildings and Grounds Committee throughout this period and I chaired the committee my last two years on the board. In addition, the college owns a significant undeveloped property in desirable locations, some of which was leased for development. I worked with the administration and its counsel in structuring these transactions.

The college worked very hard to build a diverse, committed and knowledgeable board. The Board met 3 times per year for 2 days for a combination of board and committee meetings, social encounters with other board members, faculty, administrators and students. The level of attendance and participation was extraordinarily high. Each board member was a member of 2 committees. We were collegial but not afraid to debate a question. The administration frequently arranged enrichment sessions on particular issues facing the college. For example, before the trustees voted on a bond issue, we had a session on credit enhancements and how bonds are underwritten, priced and sold. We have also had tutorials on reading and understanding college financial statements.

When the president of the college announced that he would be retiring, I was tapped to be a member of the committee that planned the presidential search and its schedule.

As a member of the Executive Committee I participated in monthly conference calls on the major policy, financial and operational issues facing the administration. We dealt with a myriad of issues on student recruiting, enrollment and retention, campus development and renovation, financial stability and fund raising, accreditation, investments, financial aid, faculty development, promotions and compensation, bond issues and financing.

I have been a donor for over 25 years to Spring Hill College and have established an endowed fund for the purpose of providing scholarships to students majoring in literature or one of the other humanities who demonstrates financial need. I have hosted numerous events at my home for alums, parents, students and prospective students.

Georgia Museum of Art. I have served on the Board of Advisors of the Georgia Museum of Art from 1992 to present. The museum is located on the campus of the University of Georgia in Athens. It is both an academic museum and the official art museum of the state of Georgia. Its permanent collection consists of American paintings (primarily 19th and 20th century), American, European, and Asian works on paper, Italian Renaissance paintings, and southern decorative arts. The museum has received national recognition for its exhibitions and publications. It also has extensive educational and outreach programs. While this board is an advisory one, it plays a significant supporting role as the chief development arm of the museum. I have a strong interest in the arts and this position has allowed me to become more familiar with many of the issues facing art museums, such as conservation, de-accessioning, borrowing and lending works of art, acquiring art, vetting donations of art and mounting exhibitions. I have also been a long term financial contributor to the museum.
