In 2000, Leslie Pantin became president of Pantin/Beber Silverstein/Public Relations, a strategic alliance between The Pantin Partnership and the Beber Silverstein Group. Today, the agency represents, among others, McDonald's, American Airlines, and Great Florida Bank (<u>www.thinkbsg.com</u>). He is a member of the Counselors Academy of the Public Relations Society of America, consisting of just 1,000 professionals from around the world.

A native of Havana, Cuba, Pantín was introduced to the world of public relations and special events in 1977, when he and a group of friends created Calle Ocho, the world's largest block party (<u>www.carnavalmiami.com</u>). This event has evolved into the 10-day festival known as Carnaval Miami, organized by the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana, where he was the founding president and served for 25 years as director.

A graduate of FSU's business school and of St. Gregory's College in Oklahoma, Pantín received the highest alumni honor from both institutions. He is a graduate of Miami's Columbus High School.

In 2006, Governor Jeb Bush appointed Pantín to a five-year term to the Board of Trustees of The Florida State University (FSU). During that term, he served as Chair of the Student Affairs Committee. From 2002 to 2006, Pantín was chairman of the Board of Trustees of Barry University. In 1992, Governor Lawton Chiles appointed Pantín to the Board of Trustees of Miami-Dade Community College, where he served for two years. He was on the advisory board of Our Lady of Lourdes Academy and served on the board of directors of St. Thomas Episcopal Parish School. He was an organizer and is vice chairman of the board of Great Florida Bank which set a U.S. record by raising \$60 million in start up capital.
