




One Year Later





Overlapping Outcomes



Total Working: 49,330

Total Enrolled: 16,272



Do graduates get jobs?



92% of the graduates found worked within one year after graduation

Do graduates pursue more education?



30% of the graduates found pursued more education

What are the starting salaries?



Highest median earnings



Engineering \$58,600

Lowest median earnings **Biological Sciences** \$29,500



Wide Variation in Salaries



Natural Resources & **Conservation Earnings** Restricted Range = \$33,600*

\$19,100 ----- \$52,700



Liberal Arts Earnings Restricted Range = \$74,600*

\$18,700 ----- \$93,300

*Restricted range used to control for unusually high or low wages



Outcomes by Racial / Ethnic Groups

The proportions of Black/African American, Hispanic, and White graduates who worked and/or enrolled were comparable to their proportions among all graduates.



Median wages were NOT comparable






Outcomes by Gender



The proportions of female graduates who worked and/or enrolled were comparable to their proportions among all graduates.

Median wages were NOT comparable







The Class of 2015 & the Class of 2014



Outcomes are comparable.

Most graduates were found working and/or enrolled.

Median annual wages increased from \$36,300 to \$39,100.
