

Second in the nation in the number and percentage of students enrolled in distance learning courses






Undergraduate Distance Learning Enrollments Continued to Increase

- Growing number of enrollments in distance learning:
 - Undergraduate students:
 - 69% of undergraduate students took at least one distance learning course, up from 66% in 2015-16.
 - 10% of undergraduates took only distance learning courses;
 - 59% took both distance learning and non-distance learning courses;
 - 31% took no distance learning courses.
 - 26% of undergraduate credit hours were in distance learning courses, up from 24% in 2015-16, 22% in 2014-15, and 20% in 2013-14.




69% of SUS Undergraduate Students Enrolled in at Least One Distance Learning Course






10% of Undergraduate Students Were Enrolled Only in Distance Learning Courses






Undergraduate Distance Learning Credit Hours Continued to Increase

Graduate Distance Learning Enrollments Continued to Increase


Growing number of enrollments in distance learning:

Graduate students:

- 27% of graduate credit hours were in distance learning, up from 25% in 2015-16, 24% in 2014-15, and 22% in 2013-14.
- 49% of graduate students took at least one distance learning course:
 - 21% took only distance learning courses;
 - 28% took both distance learning and non-distance learning courses;
 - 51% took no distance learning courses.




49% of Graduate Students Took At Least One Distance Learning Course






21% of Graduate Students Enrolled in Only **Distance Learning Courses**





Students Who Took Only Distance Learning Courses Were Typically Older than On-Campus Students, Female, and Residents of Florida

- Age: Undergraduate students taking only distance learning courses were older (average age 28) than those who took both distance learning and classroom/hybrid courses (average age 22) and those who took no distance learning courses (average age 22).
- Age: Graduate students taking only distance learning courses were older (average age 34) than those who took both distance learning and classroom/hybrid courses (average age 29) and those who took no distance learning courses (average age 29).
- **Gender:** Sixty-five percent (65%) of students who took only distance learning courses were female, while females comprised just 56% of the undergraduate student body as a whole.
- **Residency:** Ninety-six percent (96%) of undergraduates who took only distance learning courses were from Florida, while only 92% of undergraduate students who took no distance learning courses were from Florida.



Students Who Took at Least Some Distance Learning Courses Graduated Faster


