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Performance-Based Funding - A Look Back

- 2012 Chair Colson charged the Budget & Finance Committee with creating a performance-based funding model
- January 2014 Board approves a model
- \$100 M state investment appropriated (\$200 M total) for FY 2014-15
- November 2014 Board approves adjustments:
 - Metric 1 inclusion of additional employment data for military and federal gov't graduates
 - Metric 6 & 8 additional degrees added to Bachelors and Masters degrees in strategic emphasis
 - Metric 7 excluded non-US students since they are not eligible for Pell Grants

- \$150 M appropriated for FY 2015-16 (\$50 M from 2014-15 was moved to the university base) (\$400 M Total)
- January 2016 Board approves adjustments:
 - Metric 1 raised the wage threshold from \$16k to \$25k
 - Implemented a tiebreaker methodology
 - Modified the point scale from 50 to 100
- \$225 M appropriated for FY 2016-17 (\$500 M Total)





Performance-Based Funding - A Look Back


- November 2016 Board approves adjustments:
 - Metric 2 wage data expanded to include graduates outside Florida
 - Metric 3 replace the cost of a degree to the institution with a cost to the student metric
- \$245 M appropriated for FY 2017-18 (\$520 M Total)
- March 2017 Legislative change:
 - Metric 4 replace 6-year with 4-year graduation rates
 - Metric 7 required to revise benchmarks
- \$265 M appropriated for FY 2018-19 (\$560 M Total)




Performance Funding Improvement














Regulation 5.001 (7) – Tie Breakers

In the case of a tie in the number of points earned, the Board of Governors shall implement a tie breaker in the order shown as follows:

- (a) Compare the total of excellence and improvement scores;
- (b) Compare only the excellence scores;
- (c) Score metric by metric giving a point to the institution with the higher score; and
- (d) If still tied, the tie will go to the benefit of the institutions, irrespective of whether the institutions are tied for placement among the top three scoring institutions or are tied for placement among the bottom three institutions.



 - Fliminate bottom 3
 - Rounding
 - Metric 10 update
 - Hard deadline for data submissions
- Complete Performance-based Continuous Improvement Model Report:
 - By October 1, 2019, the Board of Governors, in consultation with the state universities, shall submit to the Legislature recommendations for future consideration on the most efficient process to achieve a complete performance-based continuous improvement model focused on outcomes that provides for the equitable distribution of performance funds.
