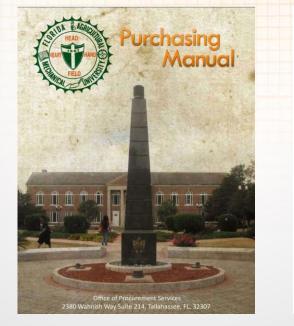

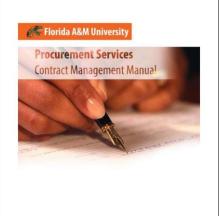

Training Acknowledgment

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Oversight and Accountability

Strategies for Ensuring Success

- The Controller's Office oversees the Ticket Box Office within Athletics
- The Athletics Oversight Taskforce provided key insights and recommendations for improvement
- The Office of Audit and Compliance tested a number of practices and made recommendations to strengthen internal controls
- The University Compliance Officer completed a detailed compliance monitoring and action plan in April 2018
 - Three broad opportunities for improvement include:
 - 1. Oversight
 - 2. Compliance with University policy and procedure, state and federal law, and external association regulations
 - 3. Accountability



Oversight and Accountability

Strategies for Ensuring Success

- Goals and action items have been identified for the three areas
- Step Owners are included for each action item
- Athletics is included as a high risk area within the institutional compliance risk assessment
- Athletics is on a six-month monitoring plan with unscheduled checks on specific issues identified through internal audit and risk assessments
- Action Plan focuses on training, enforcement and accountability, and operational structural changes

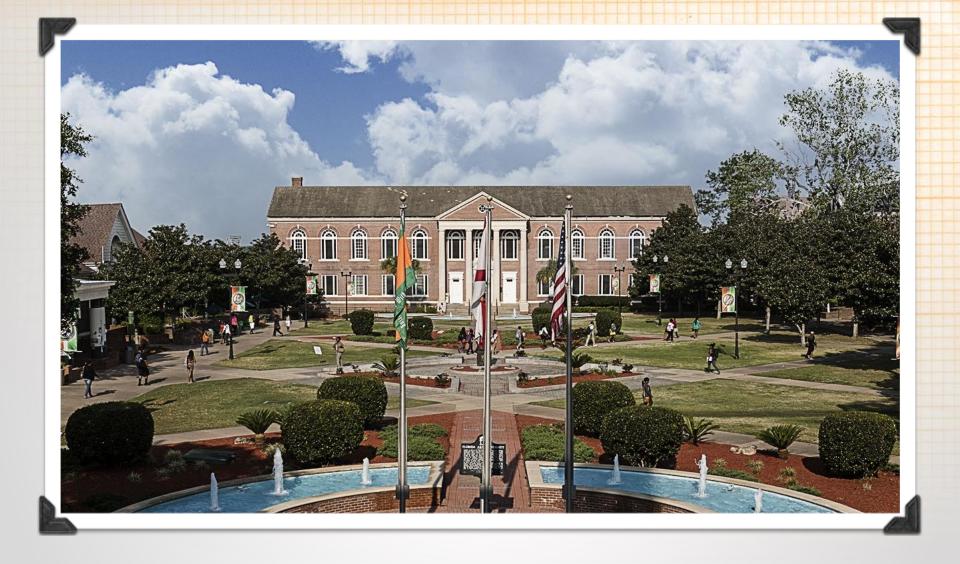
