The State University System is a Leader in Distance **Learning Enrollments**

- In the top ten states for distance learning enrollments in public universities, Florida tied for first place in terms of the percentage of public university students enrolled in distance learning courses; and
- Placed second in terms of the number of students enrolled in distance learning courses.
- The SUS enrolled almost 228,000 undergraduate students and over 38,000 graduate students - in at least one distance learning course in 2017-18.




Distance Learning Enrollments Continue to Increase

- 72% of undergraduate students took at least one distance learning course, up from 69% in 2016-17.
 - 11% of undergraduates took only distance learning courses;
 - 61% took both distance learning and non-distance learning courses;
 - 28% took no distance learning courses.
- 51% of graduate students took at least one distance learning course:
 - 24% took only distance learning courses, up from 21% in 2016-17;
 - 27% took both distance learning and non-distance learning courses, down from 28%;
 - 49% took no distance learning courses, down from 51%.




72% of SUS Undergraduate Students Enrolled in at Least One Distance Learning Course






51% of Graduate Students Enrolled in At Least One Distance Learning Course






11% of Undergraduate Students Were Enrolled Only in Distance Learning Courses






24% of Graduate Students Were Enrolled **Only in Distance Learning Courses**






Steady Increase in Undergraduate Distance Learning Credit Hours as a % of Total Credit Hours






Steady Increase in Graduate Distance Learning Credit Hours as a % of Total Credit Hours






University Distance Learning Credit Hours as a % of SUS Distance Learning Credit Hours

Graduate Credit Hours






Who are the students who took only distance learning courses?

- **Age:** Undergraduate students who took only distance learning courses were <u>older</u> (average age 28) than those who took both distance learning and classroom/hybrid courses (average age 22) and those who took no distance learning courses (average age 22).
- **Age:** Graduate students who took only distance learning courses were also older (average age 33) than those who took both distance learning and classroom/hybrid courses (average age 28) and those who took no distance learning courses (average age 30).
- **Gender:** Sixty-four percent (64%) of students who took only distance learning courses were <u>female</u>, while females comprised just 56% of the undergraduate student body as a whole.
- Residency: Ninety-five percent (95%) of undergraduates who took only distance learning courses were <u>from Florida</u>, while only 92% of undergraduate students who took no distance learning courses were from Florida.

A Variety of Online Programs/Majors Were Offered in 2017-18

- 540 online programs/majors were offered in the SUS.
- Of these programs, <u>327</u> were in Areas of Strategic Emphasis:
 - 130 STEM
 - 74 Education
 - 85 Health
 - 19 Global
 - 19 Gap Analysis
