
#### **UNF FTICs and Graduating Students: Successes and Challenges**

#### **Success**

69% of UNF graduates are employed in Florida the first year after graduation.

(At 71% post-graduation employment, UNF was in first place in 2011-2012; at 69% we tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> place in 2012-13.)
