Cells filled with "**** are masked where there are fewer than 10 students present within a group that is continuing education. Continuing education outcomes are based on enrollment data for the fall semester of 2016 and preliminary winter/spring semester of 2017 and include enrollments in Florida public and private colleges and universities. High school diploma includes employment data for standard high school diploma completers from Florida public schools who did not continue their education. Students may be in multiple settings which may exceed total unduplicated count.
