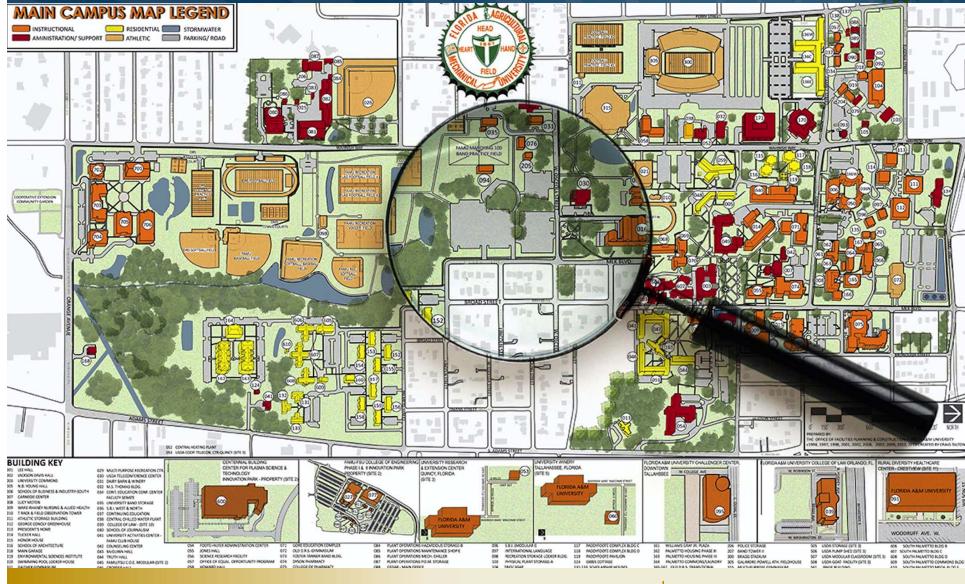

Work Plan Revision Guiding Principles

Challenge 1: Reassess goals for improvement of student success and student outcomes, and develop a plan to achieve significant success.

Challenge 2: Reassess goals for student enrollment, with regard to student mix and segmented student body growth.

Challenge 3: Reassess goals for success rates for licensure exam first time takers, and develop a plan to achieve significant success.

Challenge 4: Engage in long-term planning to support the revitalization of FAMU in light of contemporary realities and imperatives.

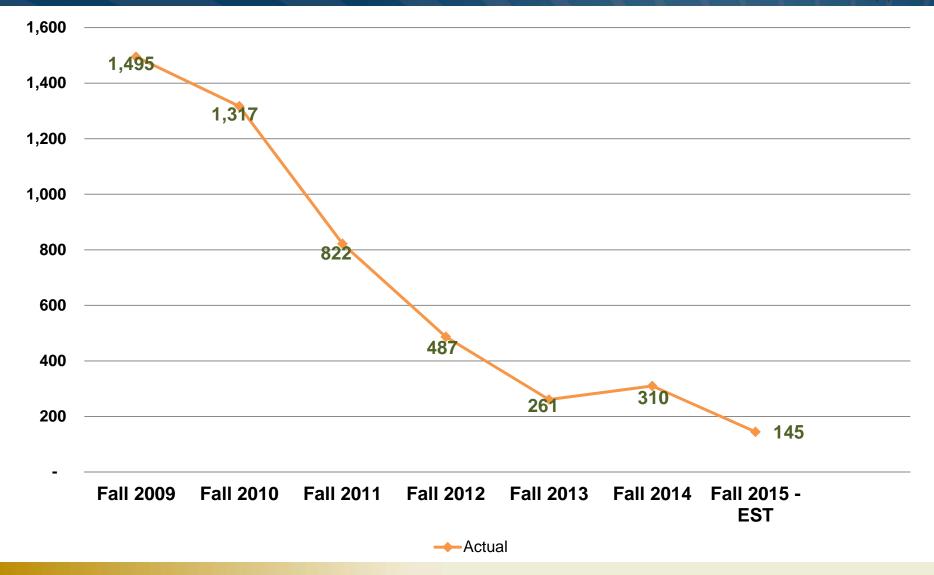
Changes in Student Enrollment Profile
