1. Academic Transition

<u>Issues</u>

- 1. Determining prerequisites can be confusing & time consuming.
- Completing prerequisites for highly sequenced majors can be challenging & difficult to do in a timely manner.
- 3. The statewide agreement does not guarantee admission into programs.



2. Admissions Process

<u>Issue</u>

Process can be time-consuming & costly for students & institutions.



3. Cultural Transition

<u>Issue</u>

Culture shock & limited time to engage in activities & events that would foster a sense of community.



4. Information about AA graduates

<u>Issues</u>

- 1. Descriptive data does not adequately describe student behavior.
- 2. Questions & analyses are complex.



Workshop Issue: Dual Enrollment

- 1. The relationship between dual enrollment courses & the AA
- Students may take courses that can not be applied to the AA or a baccalaureate degree
- 3. Admission & prerequisite courses may change
- 4. Time lag between dual enrollment & application to baccalaureate program



Workshop Issue: Prerequisite Courses

- 1. Ensuring accuracy of information across institution
- 2. Highly sequenced programs
- 3. Manual format as a series of pdf files
- 4. Number of prerequisite credit hours
- Time lag between completing prerequisite & application to baccalaureate program

Workshop Solutions: Information

Accurate & Timely Information

- 1. Revise prerequisite manual
- 2. Degree maps
- 3. Work with HS counselors to develop tools & information
- 4. Work with FCS advisors to develop tools& information

Encourage & Incentivize Best Practices

- 1. Advising on FCS campuses
- 2. Joint programs
- 3. Waive application fees
- 4. Provide scholarships
- 5. Provide programs and events

Develop a Data Toolkit

- 1. Review existing analyses
- 2. Identify & conduct studies to answer most critical unanswered questions

Workshop Solutions: Research Questions

- 1. Why are one-third of AA graduates not applying to the SUS?
- 2. Where do AA graduates who are admitted to the SUS but do not enroll go?
- 3. Where do AA graduates go who do not transfer to the SUS?
- 4. Do AA graduates transfer to the SUS without loss of credit?

Workshop Solutions: Research Questions

- 5. What are the SUS outcomes for the AA transfers by program of study?
- 6. Why do 90% of transfer students apply to only one university?
