Distance Learning vs. Online Education




- Distance Learning Defined in Florida Statutes: <u>At least 80%</u> of the direct instruction is delivered using some form of technology when the student and instructor are separated by time, space, or both.
 - Primarily Distance Learning (State University Database System): 80% 99%...
 - Fully Distance Learning (State University Database System): 100%....
- Online is the primary way in which distance learning can be delivered, but it is not the only way. Other delivery mechanisms for distance learning courses include – but are not limited to - one-way transmissions by satellite or cable TV, and course delivery by mobile or portable devices.

Undergraduate Enrollments In At Least One Distance Learning Course





Undergraduate Credit Hours in Distance Learning Courses




DISTANCE LEARNING AS A PERCENT OF UNDERGRADUATE CREDIT HOURS



% of SUS Total Undergraduate Credit Hours in Distance Learning






Graduate Enrollments In At Least One Distance Learning Course




PERCENTAGE OF GRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN AT LEAST ONE DISTANCE LEARNING COURSE



Graduate Credit Hours in Distance Learning Courses




DISTANCE LEARNING AS A PERCENT OF GRADUATE CREDIT HOURS
