


Impact of Training - 2020-2021 Academic Year

System-Wide Hazing Incidents



Regulation 6.021 requires State University System institutions to annually report the number of hazing incidents requiring a disciplinary proceeding that resulted in the student, organization, or group being found responsible for a hazing incident.
