SOURCE: Board of Governors staff analysis is based on individual-level data for 65,682 graduates from the State University Data System (SUDS). These records were matched to records from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), which relied on both state and national employment and wage data sources. The state-level data source used by DEO was the Florida Education & Training Placement Information Program (FETPIP), and the national data source was the State Wage Interchange System (SWIS). Notes: Board staff applied a minimum threshold of 30 graduates and more than 10 with full-time wages for a program to be considered in these rankings. Cells filled with ***** are masked where there are fewer than 10 students present within a group that is continuing education. Previous versions of this report utilized FETPIP's published reports for 4th quarter (Oct-Dec) wages within Florida that did not include non-Florida employment data. Beginning with the 2017-18 Economic Security Report, Board of Governors staff analysis utilized employment data from Florida's Unemployment Insurance database and the State Wage Interchange System database (SWIS) provided by DEO which contains both in-state and out-of-state employment outcomes for Florida graduates. Full-Time Threshold and Full-Time Annualized Wages were calculated by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity using Quarter 2 of 2019 where those working full-time are identified as earning an annualized wage of at least \$17,597.
