# Regulation 6.005: Admission of Associate in Arts High School Students



## Purpose

Provides institutions flexibility in admitting high school students with an A.A. degree to benefit students



## Impetus for Action

**Benefits students** who earn an A.A. degree before high school graduation

**Joint recommendation from FL College System**



## Proposed Regulation

- Qualified students may be considered for admission as an A.A. transfer
- Allows those considered as A.A. transfer to be test optional
- Requires institutions to inform students of requirements & responsibilities



## Impact on Institutions

- Update policies, regulations, & data reporting
- Submit admission decision as either first-time-in-college (FTIC) or A.A. transfer

# Regulation 6.006: Acceleration Mechanisms



## Purpose

Provides time & cost savings for students seeking a baccalaureate degree



### Impetus for Action

2022 Legislative Session  
section 1007.271, Florida Statutes



### Proposed Revisions

- Dual enrollment students cannot be charged for instructional materials
- Removes language concerning reimbursement from school districts & boards of trustees



### Impact on Institutions

- Update articulation agreements concerning dual enrollment to reflect no charges or reimbursement for instructional materials

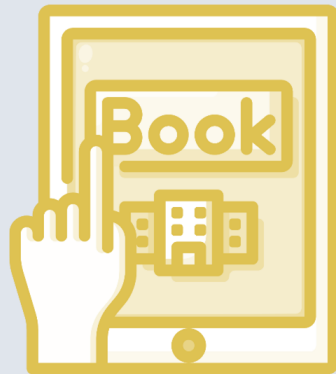


# Regulation 8.003: Textbook & Instructional Materials Affordability



## Purpose

Expands requirements for lists of required & recommended course materials for increased transparency



### Impetus for Action

**2022 Legislative Session**  
section 1004.085, Florida Statutes



### Proposed Revisions

The list of course materials must be:

- searchable & downloadable
- include course syllabi for general education core courses
- remain posted for 5 academic years



### Impact on Institutions

- Requires developing & maintaining a public, searchable database
- Expands annual reporting requirements

# Regulation 8.007: Articulation



## Purpose

Apply credits, where possible, to meet general education requirements over electives



## Impetus for Action

**2022 & 2021 Legislative Sessions**  
section 1007.24 & 1007.25, Florida Statutes



## Proposed Revisions

- Recognizes that specified associate in science degree program students will transfer in general education core coursework
- Requires transfer credit be evaluated first for general education consideration



## Impact on Institutions

- Institutions may need to modify transfer evaluation processes

# Regulation 8.010: Common Prerequisites



## Purpose

Provides for equitable treatment of students when considering baccalaureate program admission



## Impetus for Action

Technical amendment for **clarification**



## Proposed Revisions

- No +/- minimum coursework grades in common prerequisites
- Courses in the Common Prerequisite Manual must be accepted



## Impact on Institutions

- Institutions may need to adjust admission policies & grading practices



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
