SUBJECT: Public Notice of Intent to Amend Board of Governors Regulation 8.007, Articulation

PROPOSED COMMITTEE ACTION

Consider approval of Public Notice of Intent to Amend Board of Governors Regulation 8.007, Articulation.

AUTHORITY FOR BOARD OF GOVERNORS ACTION

Article IX, Section 7, Florida Constitution

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Board of Governors Regulation 8.007 provides guidance on numerous articulation issues outlined in, among others, sections 1007.23 and 1007.25, Florida Statutes. The regulation ensures consistency among universities and the Florida College System, thereby allowing students to proceed toward their educational objectives as rapidly as their circumstances permit.

The proposed amendment to this regulation addresses two issues to align the regulation to recent statutory changes. First, the 2021 Legislature amended section 1007.25, Florida Statutes, directing students entering an associate in science program in the 2022-2023 academic year to complete one general education core course in each subject area as part of the general education requirements. Second, the 2022 Legislature amended section 1007.24, Florida Statutes, directing institutions to require transfer credit be applied towards general education requirements before being applied as elective credit.

The proposed changes to this regulation align regulatory language with the new statutory requirements.

If approved by the Academic and Student Affairs Committee and the Board of Governors, the amended regulation will be available for public comment for thirty days. If no concerns are raised during that time, the regulation will come before the Board of Governors for final approval at the next meeting.

Dr. Christy England, Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs, will provide an overview of the amendment to the regulation.
