Regulation 8.002 Self-Supporting & Market Tuition Rate Program & Course Offerings



Primary Issues

1. Inconsistent implementation across the System
2. Tuition & fees for all undergraduate coursework must comply with Section 1009.24, Florida Statutes
3. No mechanism for Board staff to evaluate potential supplanting of E&G programs
4. Students not fully aware of all program options & associated costs



Solutions

1. Outline allowable types & levels of continuing education with more specificity
2. Reinforce statutory limits on tuition & fees for undergraduate coursework
3. Establish a mechanism to review new programs & evaluate potential supplanting
4. Provide visible, comprehensive program cost information about all options

Regulation 8.002 Self-Supporting & Market Tuition Rate Program & Course Offerings



Purpose

Clarify policies regarding allowable activities & reporting requirements for self-supporting & market tuition rate programs



Impetus for Action

Address consistent implementation of these programs at State University System institutions



Proposed Revisions

- Clarifies policies regarding allowable activities & educational levels, program review procedures, & reporting requirements in the State University System



Impact on Institutions

- Institutions must submit documentation for all new degree programs
- Institutions may offer self-supporting undergraduate certificate programs but not degree programs
- Boards of Trustees must approve annual reports

Purpose

Outlines the requirements & process for academic program termination or suspension



Impetus for Action

A need to update & streamline the regulation for efficiency & alignment with other Board regulations



Proposed Revisions

- Allows institutions to terminate programs at the doctoral & professional level with notification to Board office rather request permission from the Board
- Aligns the regulation with termination requirements outlined Board Regulations 8.002 & 8.008



Impact on Institutions

- Provides additional flexibility



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
