



- It will be online only



THE ACT TEST – State and District

State and District Testing

- **For:** Grade 11 primarily; grade 10 (early scores); grade 12 (senior retake)
- Time: Multiple Fall and Spring test date options, selected from those on the state and district website
- Place: Students' own classrooms during weekday
- Format options: On paper or online, per school or district decision
- Test types: The ACT test or the ACT test with writing, per school or district decision
- Pricing (2022–2023): Paper \$50.50 per student for ACT; \$65.25 per student for ACT with writing; Online – \$50.25 per student for ACT; \$65 per student for ACT with writing, with additional discounts via the FRLP





Test in your own classroom!

In-school testing. Students and schools alike benefit from weekday testing.

- Ease and comfort of testing in a familiar environment during the school day
- Prompt intervention for improvement
- Expanded awareness of college and career opportunities among all students



Retesting has real value!

Retest/Retake. Research shows the value of retakes for learning is clear.

- Increased test scores in 57% of students testing
- Resulted in increases in average composite scores compared to first- and second-test instances
- Supports competitive advantage that improves with higher ACT scores

Value of Retesting

In Florida, 27,813 of the 2021 graduates taking the ACT two or more times had an average Composite Score of 21.6.
Graduates taking the ACT only once (45,380 students) had an ACT composite score average of 19.3.

FEE WAIVERS AND MORE for the ACT

ACT Fee Waiver Program

- Covers basic registration fee on national test taken in junior or senior year
- May be used for 4 administrations for the ACT
- Allows students to send scores to four college choices when registering for the test
- Allows any number of free additional score reports after registration
- Provides results to inform instruction through online reporting shortly after tests are scored
- Includes free access to test prep



Available to qualifying students



Four waivers per student



Free test prep at registration



Fee Waivers and More

Fee Waivers:

- Available to high schools, active Upward Bound programs, and qualifying not-for-profit assistance organizations
- Ordered from ACT by school officials for identified eligible students (normally delivered within 10 days)
- Used by eligible students during registration on MyACT
- Delivered and applied electronically (not via mail)

FEE WAIVERS AND MORE for the ACT

Free Score Reports:

 Unlimited additional score reports (ASRs) available to eligible students using fee waivers, when selecting schools at registration

Free Test Prep:

 Free 1-year subscription to The Official ACT Self-Paced Prep Course, powered by Kaplan, automatically added during registration on MyACT

Updates and Enhancements

• Fee Waivers are being delivered as PDF files via email now, but customers still order from the same location.




GETTING TO KNOWTAA Supports for English Language Learners

English learners may utilize which of the following supports if approved by ACT:

- 1. Extended time, not to exceed time-and-a-half
- 2. Approved word-to-word bilingual dictionary (no definitions)
- 3. Test directions in the native language
- 4. Testing in a familiar environment/small group
- 5. All the above





Online Reporting


A free interactive data analysis platform, available for all schools, states, and districts with ACT testing data at no cost through success.act.org.


- Provides current and historical student data to disaggregate, filter, and customize reports
- Allows contract states to view contract reports as well as national, state, and district data
- Delivers data online after each test administration

ONLINE REPORTING

Access: ACT Online Reporting Portal

- Access the portal via success.act.org.
- To use the portal, you need to have been granted access to the data via your Trusted Agent (appointed by your school or district).






ACT PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

ACT Instructional Mastery (AIM)

- For: High school teachers preparing students to take the ACT test; also offered to schools, school systems, and educator organizations
- Topics: Courses in each of the ACT subject tests (English, math, reading, science, and writing)
- Time: A 14-hour program per course, presented live by an ACT expert; typically delivered over two seven-hour days.
- Format options: Online/virtual and onsite/in-person formats, with a maximum of 30 participants foreach course
- Key learning objective: Providing educators with the skills most critical for successful student preparation for the ACT test
