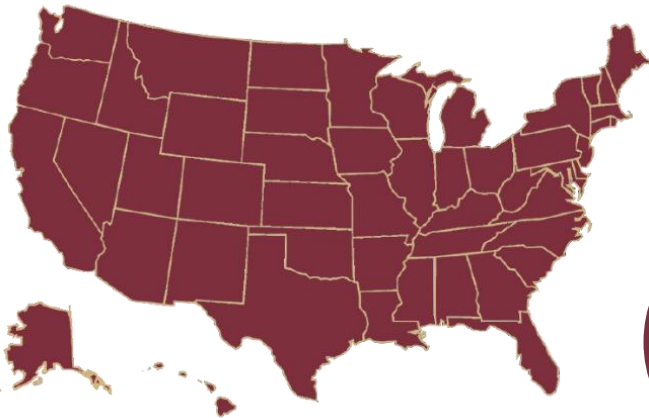

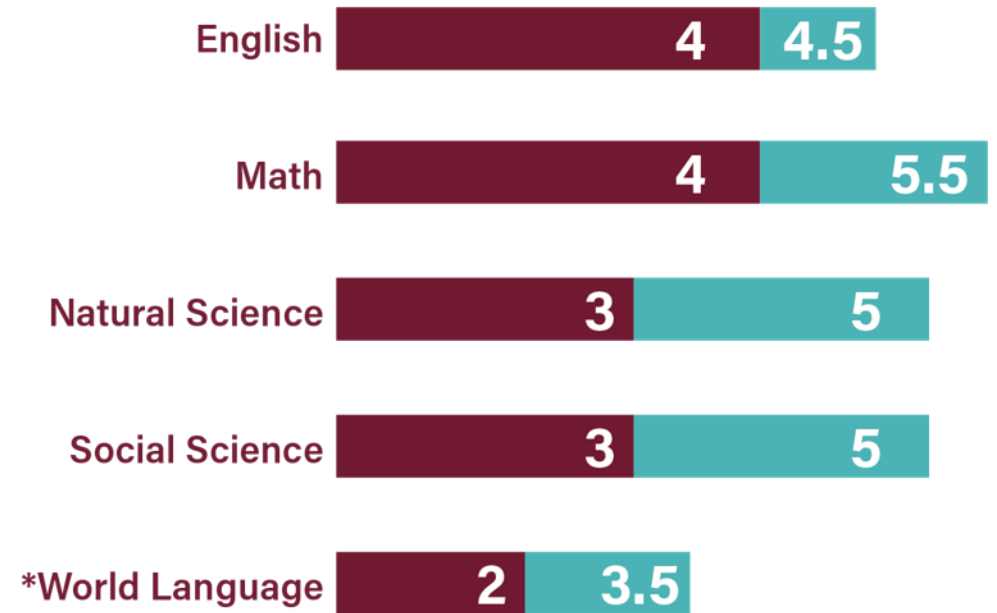

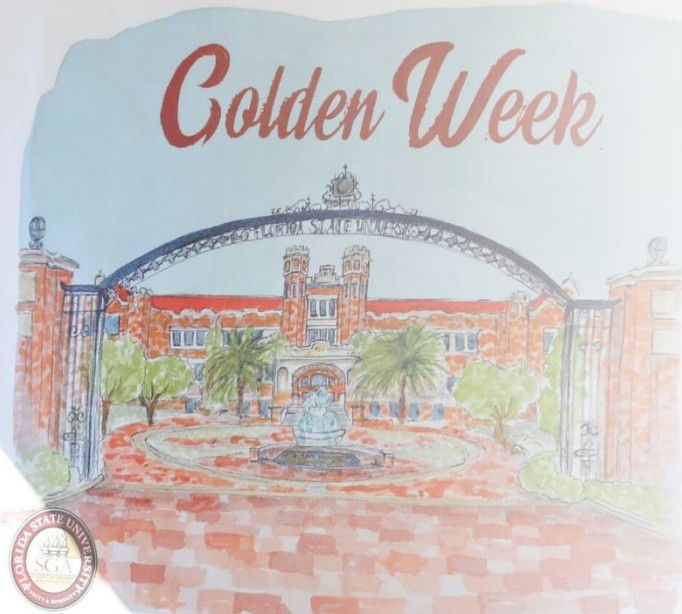

Interaction Between Childhood Health Problems and Cognitive Reappraisal is Associated with Depression in Older Adults

Abstract

We completed secondary data analyses using AFHQ to investigate the direct effects of childhood health and cognitive reappraisal on depression. We created measures of early lifetime childhood health and cognitive reappraisal and included them in a hierarchical linear regression model.

To assess the interaction term, we included the 2-way of each independent variable. For all analyses, we controlled for household income, age, sex, and education.

Individuals with missing data were excluded from analyses resulting in a final N=10,000.

Results

Conclusion

While there is a link between childhood health and cognitive reappraisal, the link is not as strong as we hypothesized.

The finding that high cognitive reappraisal is associated with depression is surprising and needs to be replicated.
