SUBJECT: Public Notice of Intent to Amend Board of Governors Regulation 6.006, Acceleration Mechanisms

PROPOSED COMMITTEE ACTION

Consider approval of Public Notice of Intent to Amend Board of Governors Regulation 6.006, Acceleration Mechanisms.

AUTHORITY FOR BOARD OF GOVERNORS ACTION

Article IX, Section 7, Florida Constitution

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Board of Governors Regulation 6.006, Acceleration Mechanisms, defines and outlines acceleration mechanisms available for students to earn college credits prior to enrolling at a state university and shorten their time to a degree.

The regulation includes a specific list of approved credit-by-examinations, including those associated with the Advanced Placement Program of the College Board, the International Baccalaureate Program, the Advanced International Certificate of Education Program, DANTES/DSST, Excelsior College, Defense Language Proficiency Test, and the College-Level Examination Program.

Board staff propose an amendment to align the regulation with House Bill 1537, which was signed into law on May 10, 2023. The law requires the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education to develop courses that align with section 1007.25, Florida Statutes, for students in secondary education. For each course developed, the Department of Education must annually identify and publish the minimum scores, maximum credit, and course or courses for which credit is to be awarded.

To accommodate these new courses, Board staff propose deleting the specific list of examinations from the regulation and referencing the Articulation Coordinating Committee Credit-by-Exam Guidelines as annually approved by the Board of Governors.

The second part of the proposed amendment recognizes the Credit or Clock Hour for Law Enforcement Experience Equivalency List as an acceleration mechanism that the Board of Governors approved at its August 30, 2023, meeting. This is a list of postsecondary course equivalencies and the minimum postsecondary credit or career education clock hours that must be awarded for law enforcement training and experience.

If approved by the Academic and Student Affairs Committee and the Board of Governors, the amended regulation will be available for public comment for 14 days. If no concerns are raised, the regulation will come before the Board of Governors for final approval at the next meeting.

Dr. Lynn Nelson, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs, will provide an overview of the proposed amendment to the regulation.
