Two FSU College of Nursing faculty members have created the Institute on Digital Health and Innovation that will focus on the intersection of digital innovation, big data, and health care. The institute will emphasize the use of digital tools in health education, messaging, and treatment; inspire collaboration and innovation across the university and health care industry; and provide training for students and postdoctoral fellows through research. Additionally, the institute will provide practical experiences to students who could apply research and a digital health approach to careers, in, for example health care, public service or academia. FAMU unveiled the new Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Center for Excellence in partnership with Aura Air, a leading global provider of smart air technology. The COE will serve as an authoritative center for studying, testing, and analyzing indoor air quality in the State of Florida. The Center will recommend methods and technology to effectively improve indoor air quality with active air monitoring, filtering, and ventilation. Additionally, the Center will house IAQrelated studies and serve as an education hub to support a state-wide IAQ program.





FLORIDA POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY

Five researchers from Florida Poly have been recognized as being among the top 2% of scientists globally on a prestigious annual list compiled by Stanford University. This is the third year Florida Poly researchers were recognized on the list of top scientists in the world. The recognitions were separated into two categories: work and citations in the last year and work and citations over a scientist's entire career.

Many FGCU faculty and staff continue to face financial hardship as they work to recover from the loss and damage of their homes, vehicles, and personal belongings related to Hurricane Ian. In an effort to provide bridge funding to those facing stormrelated financial challenges, FGCU created the Hurricane Ian Employee Loan Program. The funding is provided by the Foundation, the Financing Corporation and donations to the Ian Relief Fund. All impacted employees hired before Oct. 5, 2022, are eligible to apply for up to \$10,000. Loans are interest free and will be paid back through payroll deduction over the next three years. The Program application launched on Jan. 3, 2023 and full details of the loan terms are explained on the application.
