Introduction

Current Statute & Board Regulation

Section 1009.24(3)(b) Florida Statues states:

The Board of Governors may establish tuition for graduate and professional programs and out-of-state fees for all programs. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the sum of tuition and out-of-state fees assessed to nonresident students must be sufficient to offset the full instructional cost of serving such students. However, adjustments to out-of-state fees or tuition for graduate programs and professional programs may not exceed 15 percent in any year.

Board Regulation 7.001 states:

The Board of Governors may establish tuition for graduate and professional programs and out-of-state fees for all programs pursuant to law.

- (a) The university board of trustees may submit a proposal to establish tuition or increase tuition for existing graduate and professional programs, or out-of- state fees pursuant to law. The proposal shall be in a format and submitted by a deadline designated by the Chancellor, and include at a minimum:
 - 1. The program or programs for which the proposed tuition rate will be assessed;
 - 2. The current and proposed tuition rate for the program or programs;
 - 3. The purpose of the proposed tuition rate;
 - 4. The estimated revenue to be generated as a result of the proposed tuition rate; and
 - 5. Identification of how the revenues from the proposed tuition rate will be utilized to support students and the mission of the university.

Current Process

If a university would like to recommend an increase for implementation in the upcoming fall semester, the proposal would need to be submitted in time for the Board of Governors to consider the increase no later than a June meeting. Earlier would be preferable to allow university staff to implement the increase (technology, website, etc.), address any financial aid packages, and inform students.

If the proposal by the university is for an across-the-board increase, the increase would be considered by the Budget & Finance Committee. If the proposal is for a specific program, the increase would go to the Academic & Student Affairs Committee.

History


Universities do not charge the same per-credit-hour amount for the out-of-state fee (hereafter referred to as "fee"). The last increases were in 2012, and only two universities increased the fee at that time. Some universities have not increased their fee since 2004.

For undergraduates, USF is the lowest per credit hour at \$346.50 and UF is the highest at \$707.21. USF is also the lowest for graduates at \$424.52, while FGCU is the highest at \$883.13.



Out-of-State National Rankings

In 2023-24, for undergraduate out-of-state students, Florida has the 3rd lowest tuition and fees in the country at \$21,690, approximately 28 percent lower than the national average of \$30,140.



For graduate out-of-state students, Florida is approximately 15 percent lower than the national average.



Enrollments

With Florida having the number one higher education system in the country, universities increasing in the national rankings, and low tuition and fees, Florida is a destination state for out-of-state students. Since 2012, the number of undergraduate and graduate out-of-state students has increased significantly.

Since 2012, the total number of undergraduate out-of-state students has increased by 168 percent (21,104 students). Graduate out-of-state students have increased by 54 percent (8,845).

Out-of-State Fee Increase - Revenue Estimates

If the proposed out-of-state fee increase is approved by the Board for the upcoming academic year, each university, based on its mission and student demographics, should make its own decision on whether to increase out-of-state fees and by how much.

Below are estimates for out-of-state undergraduate and graduate 5, 10, and 15 percent fee increases. These estimates do not consider any statutory or discretionary waivers that a university is required to or may provide and it assumes no change in student credit hours from the prior year.

Professional Programs

Regarding professional programs, the most common are law and medicine, but others include, but are not limited to, veterinary medicine, pharmacy, and dentistry.

Law:

Four universities have law schools, with 18 percent of those students from out-of-state.

The out-of-state fee ranges from \$11,028 annually at FIU to \$15,970 annually at FSU. If all schools increased by 15 percent, the total estimated incremental revenues generated would be approximately \$724,000.

Medicine:

Medical programs are located at six universities, with an out-of-state enrollment of 653 students. Out-of-state students comprise about 22 percent of the total medical school enrollments.

The annual fee ranges from \$20,181 at USF to \$34,421 at FAU. If all schools increased by the maximum of 15 percent, total estimated incremental revenues generated would be approximately \$1.2 million.
