
OFFICE OF PUBLIC POLICY EVENTS

SECTION 1001.93, FLORIDA STATUTES

requires each state university within the SUS to establish an Office of Public Policy Events and appoint a Director of Public Policy Events. Universities are required to host two events during the fall semester and two events during the spring semester, representing a diversity of perspectives. Speakers and presenters can be selected from within the state university community or invited in to present a different perspective.

The establishment of Offices of Public Policy Events across all institutions of the State University System of Florida supports the System's mission to cultivate student success and civic readiness. ELEVATING STUDENT SUCCESS

The Florida Board of Governors approved the 2025 Accountability Plans for each university and for the State University System of Florida (SUS), reaffirming Florida's commitment to prioritizing student success. These plans track and evaluate progress toward the vision and goals outlined in SUS 30, the System's new strategic plan. Florida continues to serve as a national model of excellence in higher education, achieving a record-high four-year graduation rate of 66% and increasing the median wages of bachelor's graduates to \$51,000 one year after graduation.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE

2025 SYSTEM ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN

- The four-year graduation rate **increased to 66%**, a two percentage point increase, setting a record high for the System.
- The percentage of bachelor's degrees awarded within programs of strategic emphasis rose from **59% to 60%**.
- The four-year graduation rate for Pell recipients **increased to 62%** from 60%.
- The three-year graduation rate for Florida College System Transfers with an Associate of Arts degree **increased to 64%**, up two percentage points.
- The number of first-time-in-college students returning for their sophomore year at the same institution **increased to 90**%, a one percentage point increase.
- For the first time in SUS history, research expenditures **exceeded \$3 billion**, a \$200 million increase from the previous year.
- The percentage of bachelor's graduates enrolled or employed one year after graduation **increased to 74%**, up from 73%.
- The median wages of bachelor's graduates employed one year after graduation **increased to \$51,000**, representing a \$10,000 improvement in four years.

WORLDWIDE RANKINGS

The State University System of Florida (SUS) continues to demonstrate how collaborative innovation fuels economic development. For the eighth straight year, five SUS institutions earn placements on the National Academy of Inventors Top 100 Worldwide Universities List — reflecting research that translates into patents, commercialization, and real-world solutions. From UF at #13 to USF, UCF, FIU, and FSU rising in their global rankings, these outcomes demonstrate that when 12 distinct universities collaborate as one System, Florida accelerates inventions that transform communities, strengthen industries, and drive statewide economic growth.


