# THE STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM Graduating High-Quality Nurses



The **State University System of Florida (SUS)** offers a range of programs for students interested in pursuing a career in nursing, a critical field of study that benefits all Floridians.

Currently, 10 universities offer 40 nursing programs at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels. There are 10 bachelor's programs that provide multiple pathways to earning a nursing degree, including second-degree and accelerated programs, as well as a program specifically designed for veterans.

Over the past decade, university nursing programs have expanded their capacity to serve prospective nursing students, increasing the number of available slots by 80%, or 1,262 student slots. The Governor and Florida Legislature have supported this effort by providing \$46 million through the **PIPELINE** and **LINE** programs, which are designed to expand nursing education in Florida.

SUS nursing programs have high graduation rates, perform well on the **National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX)**, and graduates are employed at high percentages. These positive outcomes demonstrate the System's contribution to the nursing workforce in Florida, helping to ease shortages faced by the state.

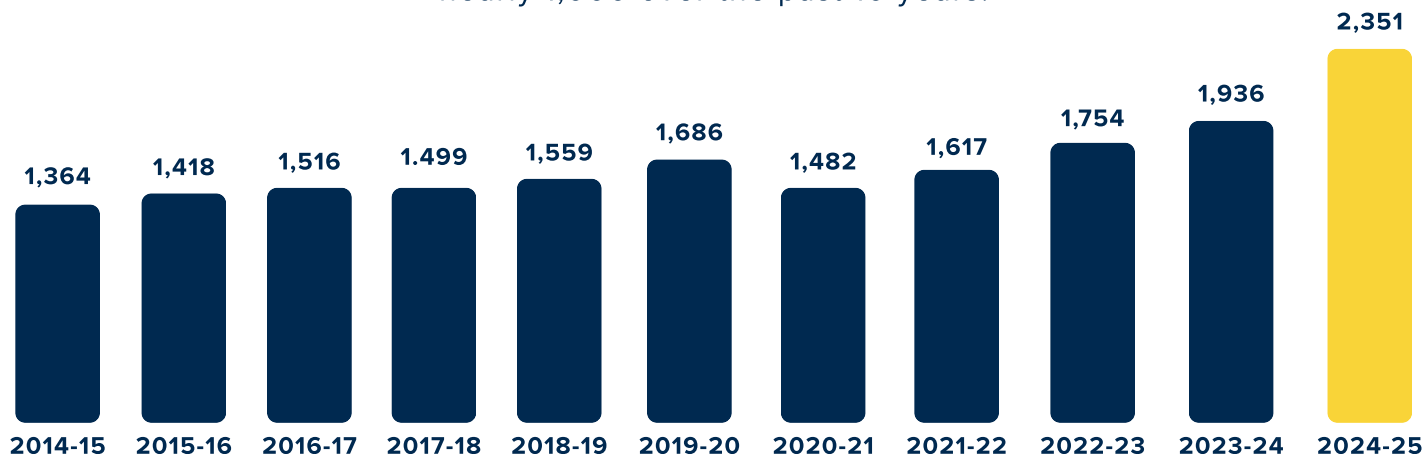

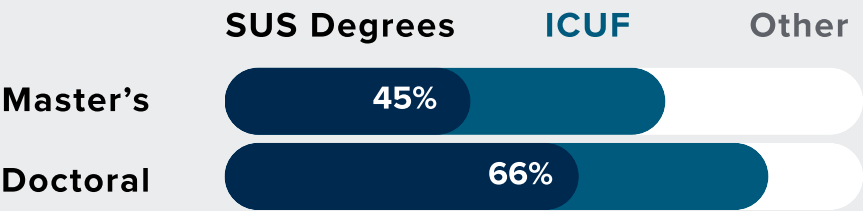

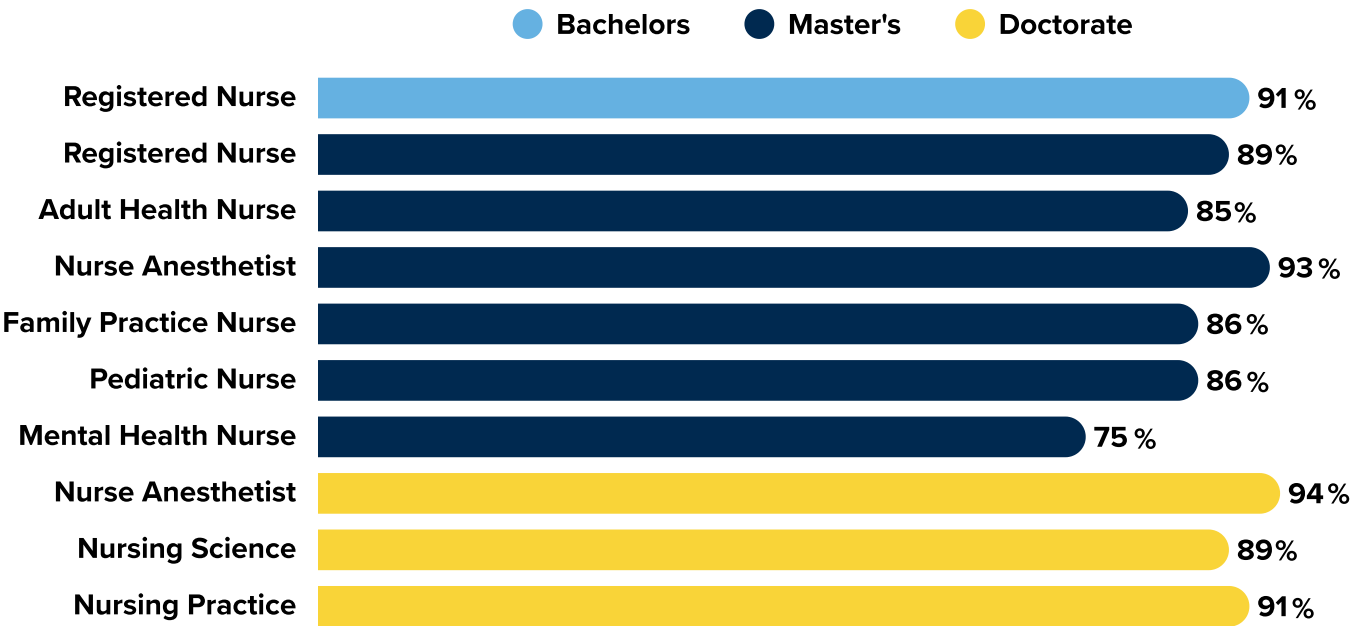
# EMPLOYMENT & SALARIES OF Nursing Graduates
