BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Florida Legislature passed a sweeping campus safety reform measure, HB 757 (2026), which the Governor subsequently approved on May 15, 2026. The legislation establishes several provisions of law intended to equip Florida's public postsecondary institutions with the tools and resources needed to enhance campus safety for students, faculty, and staff.

To implement the provisions of HB 757 (2026), Board staff propose adopting Regulation 3.0015, Campus Safety and Security. The regulation establishes key provisions to strengthen institutional readiness by requiring universities to implement a public safety reporting application or a mobile suspicious reporting tool, provide annual mental health training for faculty and staff, and establish threat management teams. It also requires universities to post information regarding campus safety, mental health, and suicide prevention on campus and on their websites. To support continuous improvement, all universities must conduct annual university-wide security risk assessments and establish post-incident recovery policies.

Ms. Emily Sikes, Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs, will provide an overview of the proposed regulation.
