This is a lease agreement to acquire control of a building located in Econfina River State Park which will be used as both a research station and a facility to host undergraduate teaching opportunities.

This site provides collaborative opportunities for research for the departments of biology, anthropology, chemistry, Scientific and Technical Communication), Tourism, and Civil, Environmental & Construction engineering. Each department has expressed the desire to utilize this location for various activities for both faculty research, as well as student research opportunities in the area of field work.

In addition to research, this site will provide departments the opportunity to serve the local area. The programs plan to develop interpretive displays, and potentially demonstration and classes for school children, related to the archaeology and history of the region, as well as the biological and hydrological characteristics of the region. This may also include brining school children to the Center at the end of UCF field courses to see the results of the university student's research. We will explore the potential engagement of local residents to act as docents to work with school groups and the general public during their visits to the Center.

The building will need minor renovations (installation of benches and cabinets) prior to utilization. This is anticipated to occur during summer 2020. These modifications will allow for possible faculty field research to commence by fall 2020.

This is not a dedicated teaching site, but a special site to allow students from a variety of disciplines a short field experience in relatively close traveling distance.

Optional courses in the BS in Biology, MS in Biology, and PhD in Integrative and Conservation Biology, as well as in programs offered by the Department of Anthropology and the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering may utilize this site as a field experience within these courses. These courses were waiting for development or revision after the site was approved.

The Site is an approximate 0.25-acre parcel of land developed with an approximate 2,080 square-foot residential structure, constructed in 1988, consisting of two conjoined units that are currently leased as vacation condominiums. The property is located on the west bank of the Econfina River, northeast of the entrance to the Econfina River State Park. The property parcel number is 01163-060; There is no need for any additional facilities.
