SUBJECT: University of South Florida (USF) Supplemental Educational Plant Survey

PROPOSED BOARD ACTION

Review and validate the completed USF Supplemental Educational Plant Survey (EPS).

AUTHORITY FOR BOARD OF GOVERNORS ACTION

Article IX, Section 7, Florida Constitution; Sections 1013.03 and 1013.31, Florida Statutes

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

An EPS (or Survey) is required at least once every five (5) years for all public educational entities, including universities. Occassionally, a university may request a supplemental EPS to meet the changing needs of the university and, to that end, help qualify a project for consideration for inclusion in the PECO preliminary selection group.

At the request of the USF, Board staff assisted university staff with the Supplemental EPS to help ensure that the requirements of section 1013.31, F.S., were satisfied. As a result of the Supplemental EPS process, the Survey Recommendations were revised to include various renovation and remodeling projects, as well as the removal of two proposed facilities; the Cybersecurity/Data Center and the Public Safety building, and the addition of one new facility; the Judy Genshaft Honors College (Tampa campus). An overview of USF's projected total space needs and survey-recommended additions, as a result of the Supplemental EPS process, is reflected in the chart below.
