
Whilst studying at Oxford University three years ago, Agne Milukaite, like the rest of the local student community, used a bike to get around the city. And what was second nature to the native Lithuanian who hailed from a 'biking town' became the germ of an idea for an online bike-sharing scheme.

Oxford-based peer-to-peer bike sharing website cycle.land is seeing user numbers increase by 100% month on month, with hundreds of bikes being rented out by Oxford locals.

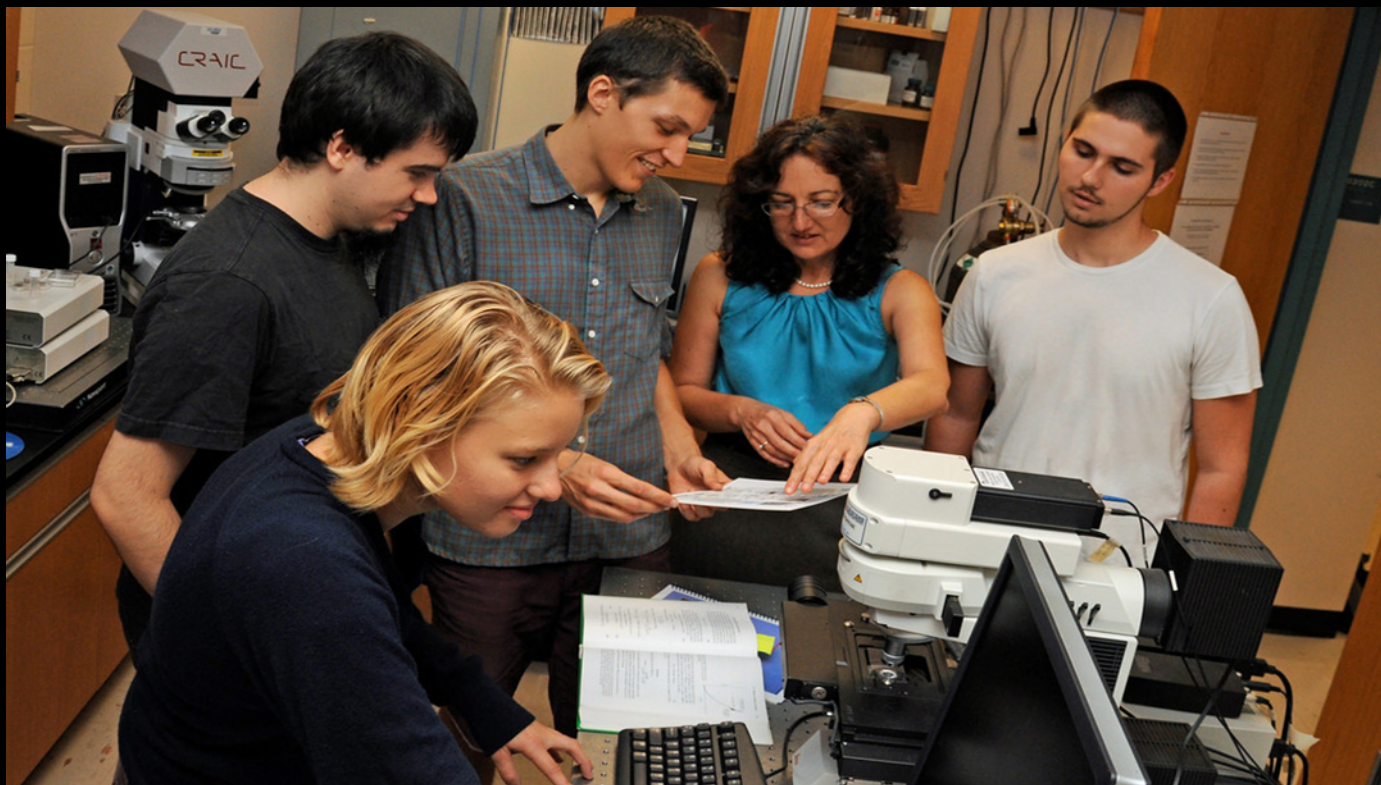

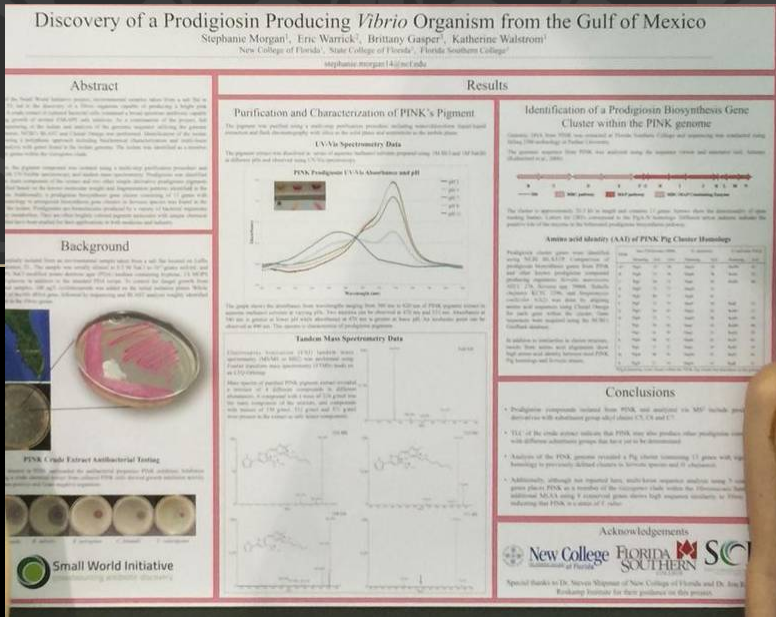

MANATEE - Scientific research that started at State College of Florida and continued at New College of Florida recently won a Bradenton resident a top student paper award at a microbiology conference.

Stephanie Morgan, who graduated from New College this spring, received the best in session student poster award at the Small World Initiative Annual Symposium, part of the American Society for Microbiology's annual meeting. Morgan's scientific research includes the discovery and analysis of a previously unknown bacterium, which could lead to new antibiotics.

Lizabelt Avila, a New College student who emigrated to Miami from Cuba, was recently awarded a Gilman Scholarship and will attend The Hague University for European Studies in the Netherlands.

Avila plans to study human rights law, global citizenship, French and other topics. She also plans to volunteer with the United Nations, International Court of Justice or another non-governmental organization based there, according to New College officials.

Avila, whose family immigrated to the United States from Cuba seven years ago, said the experience is vital to her plans of working in public service.

“New College was so important for me. My life is a constant stream of studying, in journalism that’s what you have to do,” he says. “I’m studying all the time.”

In the newsroom, Díaz-Balart is known for being a diligent researcher. Díaz-Balart learned the importance of research when he read original scholarly works in both English and Spanish for an independent study project with political science Prof. Peggy Bates, a central figure in his education.

“Quote your sources,” Díaz-Balart remembers her calling out. The lesson was an important journalistic principal. “Never make a statement you’re not able to quote. Thirty-five years later that message has helped me,” he says.
