Highlights



- \$2,160
 Average loan amounts by Florida resident undergraduates are down five years in a row
 70%
 Over two-thirds of Florida resident undergraduates are attending state universities without taking a loan
- **\$75M** Bright Futures scholarships to SUS students was \$516M in 2019-20, up \$75M from 2018-19
 - **2nd** Lowest in-state tuition for public 4-year institutions in the nation
