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### Program Proposal Requirements



## Establish Workforce Need

- Articulate specific job outcomes
- Describe job market needs

## Identify Hard & Soft Skills

- Describe content, skills students will learn, & assessment of skill development
- Explain process for identifying industry-driven competencies (required for STEM programs)

## Industry Informs Student Learning Outcomes



#### **Licensing Boards may require**

- minimum performance on licensing exam
- endorsement of licensed professionals
- supervised internship

### Accreditation

#### **Programmatic accreditation may require**

- instruction on specific content
- program outcomes
- employer input

**Student Learning Outcomes** 

#### All programs must document (Board Reg. 8.016)

- discipline knowledge & critical thinking skills
- faculty review & stakeholder input


### **Virtual Internships**
